There is a rescue organization for just about every breed you can imagine, as well as all-breed groups, and groups who rescue other types of animals, such as: rabbits, ferrets, birds, horses and more. Once these animals are rescued, loving foster homes are needed to care for them until they are adopted into permanent homes. Procedures vary from group to group, but most private organizations cover the cost of veterinary care.



Foster parents provide lots of love, care, stability and work with the animal on basic obedience training and socialization.

This is the most common reason people give for not becoming a foster parent. We won't lie to you.
